A primary assumption about context models is that they are "crucially egocentric.

Discourse & Society

The second dimension – discourse as discursive practice – refers to rules, norms, and mental models of socially accepted behavior, reflected in text production and interpretation. Fairclough's third dimension – discourse as social practice – pivots around the larger social context that acts upon the former two dimensions.
