In Canada, on the other hand, the federal government provides funding support for health care insurance to provincial governments as long as the province follows regulations outlined in the Canada Health Act (CHA) of 1984.

Although health care is a provincial responsibility in Canada, universal hospital insurance was fully adopted by 1961; universal medical insurance followed 10 years later. Each province enacted universal insurance after the federal government offered to pay 50% of provincial hospital and medical care costs.

Most recent calls for an increased federal presence in long-term care would essentially extend the model of federalism that dominates much of health care in Canada: federal financial transfers to provinces with conditions attached.
