It flourished in the Bronze Age (3300-1300 BCE; mature period 2600-1900 BCE, pre-Harappan cultures starting c.7500 BCE) along the Indus River (hence called Indus Valley Civilization) and the Ghaggar-Hakra River, which now lies in the area of modern Pakistan, North-West India and Afghanistan (covering an area of 1.25 million km 2).
